Workshop Overview: As the EAS industry continues to expand and diversify, it is of utmost importance to keep the needs of our equine partners at the forefront of the movement. We'll discuss topics as they pertain primarily to mounted activities such as adaptive riding and/or hippotherapy. Gain a deeper understanding of appropriate equine selection (evaluate what your program needs and what to look for), proper training, conditioning and integration into programming (including appropriate workload management and effective handling techniques), regular health assessment and maintenance and other management best practices that help keep herd members engaged for the long haul. By prioritizing the physical and mental health of our equine partners, EAS programs can ensure a sustainable and fulfilling experience for both the animals and the participants. Workshop attendees should expect a combination of valuable hands-on experience with horses, classroom-based education and individualized coaching to help solidify workshop content.

10:30 - 12:00 PM The Weight of Responsibility: Setting Weight Limits for Mounted EAS Programming

Setting weight limits is a hot-button topic that can get messy, fast. It can involve a lot of uncomfortable conversations, but it is our responsibility as professionals to advocate for our equines, staff, and volunteers. Learn how to set policies to help your center be consistent and successful while navigating this difficult subject. We will have the opportunity to evaluate horses and practice techniques for assigning weight limits based on equine conformation, breed, age, and more.

INTERACTIVE. This session will be held in our arena, interacting with live equines. Virtual opportunity may be limited.

Description: Expect to learn what has become a practical approach to saddle fitting for the EAS herd at HETRA. We will talk English, Western, and even Treeless saddles. We know a healthy back is imperative for a therapy horse, but we also know we have a limited budget and have to work with the tack we have. So how can we shim, adjust, or adapt the saddles available to our program for optimum comfort for our horses? We'll take a look as a group and get a chance to feel hands-on proper and poor-fitting saddles and brainstorm about what might be a realistic approach for your center.

Description: Saddle fit can be a "feel". Use this opportunity to develop your "feel" and gain valuable feedback from a seasoned professional. The methods we use to lead our horses and the consistency in which we use that method are pivotal parts to creating an environment our horses LOVE to work in. Description: HETRA has a unique method of categorizing our horses and volunteers to ensure that each horse is matched with a leader of appropriate skill level. We put special care into educating and developing both our horses and volunteers so that everyone feels comfortable and confident in the arena. For our horses, this categorization process contributes to a significant decrease in equine burnout and allows HETRA the ability to bring newer and younger horses into programming safely. This process has significantly increased our volunteer retention and lends itself greatly to volunteers who want to do the best they can to contribute to the safest sessions possible. Expect to receive an in-depth look at why and how we developed this process as well as how to implement it at various levels of center size and resource level.
