A Message from the CEO

As I reflect on 2024, I'm filled with gratitude and pride for the incredible progress we've made together at HETRA, and I look forward to an even more impactful 2025.

At HETRA, our core programs — Therapy Services, Adaptive Riding, Adaptive Carriage Driving, and Life Skills — remained the heart of our mission. We served nearly 10% more individuals, a reflection of both the increasing demand for services and the trust our community places in us.

We expanded HETRA University with two on-site events, a steady stream of webinars, and free weekly podcast episodes of Not Just a Pony Ride, continuing to equip EAS professionals nationwide. Our team also shared insights and advocated for Equine-Assisted Services at regional and national conferences.

2024 also brought challenges and triumphs. Our annual Blue Jeans and Dreams gala was postponed due to the devastating tornadoes that swept through our area. While our facility was spared, the surrounding community faced significant damage. Thanks to our supporters who rallied around us, the event returned stronger than ever in July. I'm deeply grateful for the outpouring of support.

Behind the scenes, we welcomed new therapists and instructors, all trained in the "HETRA way," rooted in the power of the horse-human connection that truly changes lives.

Most importantly, we witnessed incredible participant progress: standing longer without support, walking independently, and expressing wants and needs verbally instead of through behavior. These milestones brought positive change for the individuals, their families, caregivers, and communities.

As I look ahead to 2025, I remain committed to innovation, excellence, and accessibility. I'm energized by the opportunities ahead and deeply thankful for everyone who helps make this work possible.

Thank you for believing in our mission, for standing beside us, and for helping us make a difference that goes far beyond a pony ride.



PARTICIPANT AGES IN CORE PROGRAMS:









A HETRA Success Story

ANNIKA'S RIDE

THE JOURNEY

Since the age of eight, Annika has had a deep passion for horseback riding. However, her life took a dramatic turn in September 2023 when a tragic accident during her freshman year in college resulted in emergency brain surgery. In the wake of this challenge, a new goal emerged: getting Annika back in the saddle.

After relocating to Omaha in March 2024, with the incredible support of her medical professionals, and the collaboration between Quality Living Inc. (QLI) and HETRA, Annika's journey to recovery began. She embraced an intensive therapy regimen from 9 AM to 3 PM daily, relearning vital skills.

During her initial sessions on the Equicizer, a mechanical horse that provided a unique therapeutic experience, Annika achieved her first step in regaining the strength needed to get back on a horse. For Annika, riding is more than just a hobby: it's her identity.

A SANCTUARY OF HOPE

HETRA provided a piece of home for Annika to help push her through those tough days. With the support of the HETRA team, she rebuilt her strength and regained confidence while preparing to return home and once again ride independently.

Taken just six months apart, the two photos to the right, highlight HETRA's remarkable impact on Annika's strength and posture, showing that community support can help us achieve anything despite life's unpredictability.







WHY HETRA IS ESSENTIAL

We close these gaps with inclusive, proven programming that draws on the horse-human connection. In 2024, HETRA served 1,918 individuals—up from 1,752 in 2023. Participants ranged from ages 2 to 100 and represented a variety of diagnoses. Supported by 488 volunteers who gave over 25,000 hours, our core programs helped people reach life-changing milestones: standing without assistance, walking independently, and speaking for the first time. These victories ripple through families, caregivers, and the community, fostering confidence, independence, and connection.

Our Impact

RECOGNIZING THE NEED

In Nebraska, 22% of adults live with a disability. and 1 in 3 have experienced a mental health challenge in the past year. Sarpy County, where HETRA operates, has **fewer than 1.5 mental health providers per 1,000** residents, and most Nebraska counties face a shortage. For those with disabilities, stigma, provider shortages, and limited services make care less accessible.
